Abstract H. Holling (see record <u>1983-22512-001</u>) suggested a definition of suppression in

terms of the relations between the independent variables (predictors) and the linear combination for predicting the dependent variable (criterion). It is argued that Holling's definition includes only a subset of A. J. Conger's (see record 1975-00077-001) absolute suppression situations. A definition of suppression situations that is in line with Holling's ideas and Conger's definition of suppression is proposed, and it is shown that the definition of suppression in terms of regression weights can be applied to linear combinations in general.
